**Town of Bluffton Hires Scott Marshall As Deputy Town Manager**

Town Manager Marc Orlando hired Scott Marshall as deputy town manager, effective Monday, December 21<sup>st</sup>. In this position, Marshall will perform high-level administrative and managerial duties such as strategic planning, budgeting and managing the implementation of Town programs, projects and policies.

Prior to this position, Marshall has been with Beaufort County since 2009. Most recently, Marshall was Beaufort County's former director of parks and leisure services (PALS) and prior to the PALS position, he was the executive director of Beaufort County Board of Election and Registration. "Scott has a proven track record of establishing efficient processes and procedures to make local government user-friendly and effective," Orlando said. "We look forward to his expertise and enthusiasm at the Town of Bluffton."

A retired Air Force officer, Marshall was also an organization and strategy consultant with Booz Allen Hamilton, Inc. During his 23-year military career, Marshall served as a nuclear weapons technician, a substance abuse counselor and a personnel officer. He also served in Operation Iraqi Freedom, during which he served as a military advisor to the Iraqi Air Force, assisting in their efforts to establish a new air force while conducting counterinsurgency operation. Marshall received the Bronze Star Medal for his service in Iraq.

Marshall earned a master's degree in public administration with a concentration in human resources from American Public University. He also earned a bachelor's degree in political science and psychology from Eastern Michigan University with a minor of military science.
